Executive Director's Message



Undoubtedly, for nearly every person in our community, the past year has felt like a never ending test of strength and determination. IRCOM entered the "year of the pandemic" with news of a significant decline in federal funding, an inevitable reduction of critical programs, and the need to layoff dozens of staff. Beyond our walls, the global pandemic closed borders, halted decades of refugee resettlement, and for many, shattered dreams of being reunited with family.

The anguish was profound. But within days of lockdown, we launched into crisis response mode. Staff, who together speak more than 20 languages, called every family, to relay in their mother tongue public health orders, to ask what they needed, to remind them we were still there. As some fam-

ilies began to run out of food, because they lost childcare or didn't have the means yet (credit cards, digital literacy, local knowledge) to get groceries safely delivered to their homes, we brought food to them. Door to door hamper delivery began. Everyone sheltered in place as required, so we came to them. For the first time in my thirteen years with IRCOM, the buildings were quiet.

The IRCOM many of us know and love is a vibrant place where laughter echoes through the halls. It is a people, uprooted and displaced, who despite everything, continue to believe in the possibility of Finding Home, Again. That is how I will always remember IRCOM; the way it took up home in my heart and I in return found family in its arms.

For now, however, this is my last Executive Director's message. It isn't a goodbye, rather, it's "until we meet again", and it is my absolute heartfelt thanks to the thousands upon thousands of people: tenants, participants, volunteers, community partners, funders, supporters, who have shared this chapter with me.

To my team, I love you. That's it. Now and always, I will love. To the Board, thank you. Thank you for the giving me a chance, I will not forget it. To Winnipeg: donors, funders, partners, thank you for taking care of your neighbours as you would your kin. In my language, Polish, when we say farewell to someone we deeply respect, we kiss their hands. I kiss your hands.

As a result, IRCOM has now demonstrated the positive social outcomes of its unique wrap around housing model and has matured as an organization to one that is efficient, effective, and resilient. We are in a stronger position for future growth.

A significant reason for that strength is due to our recently departed Executive Director, Dorota Blumczynska. She demonstrated passion and commitment. She advocated fiercely. She continuously and effortlessly built relationships in the community. She led by example. As a result, IRCOM grew steadily and flourished under her 10 years of leadership. She left knowing there was a strong, talented and devoted team ready to carry on the important work.


And so we shall.

Country of Origin





Immigration Class


